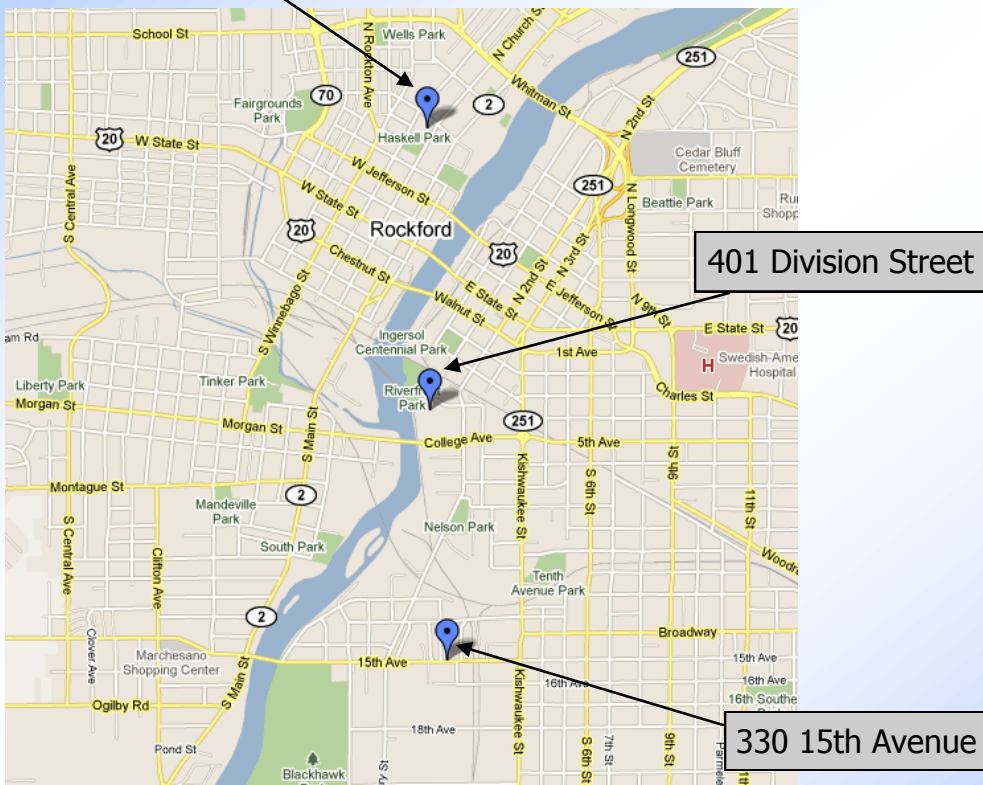

Blackhawk Park School-Linked Health Center Provides: Comprehensive medical services to all students in Winnebago County and their siblings under the age of 18. Services include: school and sport physicals, immunizations, TB testing, lead screening, routine lab testing, medication prescriptions, treatment for minor injuries/illnesses, and mental health counseling. The School Linked Health Center is a partnership between the Rockford Public School District #205, University of Illinois College of Medicine, Janet Wattles Center, Rockford Housing Authority, Winnebago County Health Department, and the Department of Health and Human Services.

Epidemiology: Collection & analysis of data for disease outbreaks, chronic conditions or diseases identified within our community.

Family Case Management: Support services for pregnant women & infants up to age one.

Public Facilities: Health code inspections of restaurants, hotels, tanning & body art facilities.

HIV Care & Prevention: Counseling, testing, and case management for persons with HIV.

Laboratory: Water tests for the public & health department programs (CLIA, IEPA & IDPH).

Lead Screening: Lead testing, education & follow-up for infants & children.

Neighborhood Housing: Regulation & follow-up for safety/nuisance complaints.

On-Site Wastewater & Private Water Supply: Inspections & permits for on-site wastewater and public/private water supplies for the County and others.

Refugee Screening: Health screening, examinations & referrals for refugees.

Reportable Diseases: Investigation & follow-up for communicable diseases.

Creating Lead Safe Homes: In-home follow up after a child has been reported with lead poisoning.

Sexual Health: Confidential diagnosis & treatment of sexually transmitted infections.

Social Work: Services for Health Department clients, including: the Neighborhood Environmental Program and community referrals.

TB Care: For referrals of positive skin tests & active TB cases in the county.

Weed & Seed: Program designed to "weed out" violent crime, gang activity & drug abuse in Ellis Heights & Kishwaukee Corridor and "seed in" economic opportunity.

WIC: Supportive food program for pregnant women, infants & children up to age 5.



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ATOD: Alcohol, Tobacco & Other Drug: a substance abuse prevention program.

Audio Visual: Vision & hearing screening for school children.

Black Male Health: Education & activities addressing health disparities for minorities.

Family Case Management: Support services for pregnant women & infants up to age one.

Genetics: Services for families with a history of birth/genetic disorders or chronic illness.

Health Screening: Health promotion & wellness screening including blood tests and adult immunizations.

Health Works: Medical case management for foster children.

High Risk Infant Follow Up: Support services for high risk infants up to age two.

IBCCP: Illinois Breast & Cervical Cancer Program; Free breast and/or cervical cancer screenings for women 35-64 who do not have insurance.

Immunizations: All recommended vaccines for children.

International Travel: Immunizations & education for people traveling abroad.

Lead Screening: Lead testing, education & follow-up for infants & children.

MRC: Medical Reserve Corps assist in community education & disaster response.

Oral Health: In-school dental education & preventive services for children.

Public Health Emergency Response: Disaster preparation & response planning.

Creating Lead Safe Homes: In-home follow up after a child has been reported with lead poisoning.

TIP: Prenatal support for women at risk for a low-birth weight infant.

Tobacco Prevention: Information & help to quit smoking.

TPP: Teen Pregnancy Prevention information for male & female students in a group setting.

TPS: Teen Parent Services includes education, support & referrals.

Violence Prevention: Activities promoting a safe and healthy community.

Vital Records: Birth & Death Certificates & burial permits.

WIC: Supportive food program for pregnant woman, infants & children up to age 5.

Women's Health: Female health exams, education, and family planning services.
